First grade continues to work on new sounds and making words with those sounds. (-nk, and -ng) The students have been applying their skills to describe characters, retell stories, and identify the main ideas and details. The students have been working on solving equations, telling time, and practicing their number sense by identifying 1 more, 1 less, 10 more, and 10 less. 3rd Quarter has definitely flown by as we can hardly believe that Spring Parent-Teacher Conferences are just around the corner! Be sure to be looking for information regarding conferences provided by your child's teacher.

2nd Grade kiddos have been working hard this quarter on many different reading and math skills. Your child has learned how to tell time to the nearest 5 minutes, how to measure in both Customary and Metric, how to retell fables and identify their central moral, on top of comparing and contrasting various fairytales from different cultures and/or authors! Take advantage of www.TurtleDiary.com for additional practice with numerous reading and math concepts learned in class. The video lessons and practice games are engaging, interactive, and educational; a win-win!

We would also like to take the time to give a friendly reminder about the Raz Kids 3rd Quarter reading goals. Please make sure your child is utilizing this wonderful reading supplement program at home as much as possible! There are 15 books selected for your child in their Reading Assignment portal. They are to listen, read, then take e-quizzes for these books before the end of the quarter.

We are working hard heading into the end of our third quarter together. All classes are preparing for our benchmark testing coming up at the end of February. Please be sure to have your child at school on time if possible. Your child's teacher will let you know the specific days your child will be testing.

Some third grade classes have enjoyed learning about different types of rocks and fossils. At the end of the quarter they will have an in class field trip where they will get to touch, hold, and explore all of the different types of rocks, minerals, and fossils they just learned about. At the end of the presentation

each student will be given their own shark tooth fossil!

All third graders learned about author's point of view

and purpose for writing. The students discovered author's purpose through reading all different types of passages. Some students were able to illustrate what author's purpose is and the characteristics of each type of writing presented.

The entire third grade team is excited going forward into the fourth quarter. Your student has worked very hard and has grown so much since July. We hope everyone has a safe and wonderful spring break!

4th grade is cruising through the 3rd quarter! With only a few weeks left before Spring Break, we are very busy mastering the remaining math standards, such as finding area and perimeter, converting both Metric and Standard measurements, solving measurement word problems, and multistep word problems, just to name a few. We are doing very well with the schoolwide Accelerated Math competition! According to the last update, 4th grade is at 1,651 points, with an 85% + average.

In Language Arts, we are doing multiple activities across the grade level, from whole class literature studies, small group book studies and book reports, to individual skill builders with Scholastic News Magazines.

In Social Studies, we are learning all about the government: why it was created and how it is run. In science, we have been learning all about environmental changes, such as slow and quick changes to earth, like erosion vs. an earthquake, how to conserve resources, and the scientific process. We have also been working very hard on our typing skills in the computer lab! It is very important that we know how to type with two hands effectively, highlight information on the computer, copy and paste, and properly search the internet for academic information.

We are looking forward to a great rest of the third quarter!

Nurse's Updates- Dana Sandlin

Arizona is reporting regional flu activity which is increasing with 247 confirmed cases in the last week. Flu shots are still available so check with your health care provider about getting your child a flu shot. It is especially important if your child has asthma or other chronic health problems. It takes about 2 weeks for the shot to be effective. To help prevent the spreading of flu and respiratory illnesses wash your hands often with soap and water, avoid touching your face with unwashed hands, cover your cough and sneezes, clean and disinfect surfaces, and stay home if your sick. Anyone who has flu-like symptoms such as fever, chills, cough, runny nose, sore throat, headache, or diarrhea or vomiting should stay home form school. If your child does get the flu please keep them home until they are fever free for 24 hours without the use of medication and have not vomited or had diarrhea for 24 hours.

If your child has new health problems or changes in their health please notify the nurse. Also please let the registrar, Mary Plunk know if there are any changes in phone numbers or contact information.

I am continuing hearing and vision screening in first grade and kindergarten. If your child does receive a referral, please have it completed by the health care provider and returned to the health office . Please call the health office at <u>480-987-7424</u> if you have any questions or concerns.
