



## **BOND FACTS**

Queen Creek School District consists of four elementary schools, one academy, two middle schools and one high school. Our enrollment is approximately 7000 students. We offer a quality educational program with top-notch educators and support staff.

To fund needed projects, the Governing Board called for a \$95 million special bond election on November 8th. If approved, the bonds will provide a second new high school, two new elementary schools and technology to support existing and new schools. The new bonds would cost the owner of a home with a \$100,000 assessed valuation an average of \$8.33 a month.

## **FUNDING SOURCES**

The district receives money from several sources: the state and federal governments, local property taxes and grants. Under state law, the district may spend the funds in two ways:

- Maintenance and operations funds are used for running the schools and go toward employee salaries, classroom supplies and transportation.
- Capital funds are used to build and equip schools, repair and upgrade existing buildings, buy school buses and purchase technology.
- Arizona has cut capital funds over the past eight years. The chart below shows what districts were entitled to, compared to what they actually received.
