VOTERS SAY "YES" FOR QCUSD OVERRIDE

Queen Creek residents approve 15% maintenance and operation budget override

QUEEN CREEK, AZ, Nov. 4, 2015 — Officials working in the Queen Creek Unified School District got some good news after votes from the Nov. 3rd general election were tallied.

The district had asked voters to approve a 15 percent budget override that would allow the district to spend more than state-allocated funds. Unofficial results from Nov. 3rd show the override passing, with 3,128 voting "yes" and 2,477 voting "no".

Queen Creek Unified School District is a public school district serving the Queen Creek area. The schools in the district are Queen Creek High School; Newell Barney Junior High School; Queen Creek Middle School; Gateway Polytechnic Academy; and Frances Brandon-Pickett Elementary, Desert Mountain Elementary, Jack Barnes Elementary and Queen Creek Elementary schools.

"Budget overrides allow school districts to tax property in their boundaries," said Dr. Perry Berry, QCUSD Superintendent, "The approved override generates approximately \$4.2 million for the district per year. Considering Arizona ranks 48th in the country for per pupil spending, this override is necessary for us to remain competitive."

"I want to thank our voters and <u>all</u> of the people who organized a structured and honest campaign on our behalf. Many people worked tirelessly to communicate the facts and encouraged our community to vote," stated Dr. Berry.

"Throughout the past several months, I have met many wonderful residents, business officials, elected officers, etc., within the Queen Creek area and I want everyone to know how impressed I am with the support they have for a quality

K-12 educational system (i.e. OCUSD). Our institution serves as a cornerstone to a strong economy and democracy and I want to encourage everyone to share the 'good news' about OCUSD."

An override election provides money for operational expenses, including salaries, benefits, supplies, purchased services, utilities and insurance. A bond election differs in that it allows the district additional funding to use for capital items such as new buildings, additions to buildings, land, school buses, renovations to buildings, furniture, equipment and technology. Queen Creek Unified School District will spend funds wisely toward programs that directly affect our students, as well as increasing vocational, art, gifted, and music opportunities. With the "yes" vote, QCUSD has committed to reduce class

sizes, and will have the ability to rehire, retain, and reward the amazing teachers QCUSD has become accustomed to.

The funds raised would support students in kindergarten through twelfth grade as follows:

- · Increase academic programs that prepare students for postsecondary education and workforce success
- Increase art and music classes throughout the District
- Increase school security to maintain a safe and secure learning environment
- · Reduce class size at the kindergarten through eighth grade level
- · Increase salaries to retain and attract exceptional teachers and staff
- · Expand and enhance athletic, ROTC, and gifted programs

The Governing Board has the responsibility to ensure the use of these funds goes toward increased academic opportunities and pay QCUSD teachers a competitive salary. The "yes" vote makes the investment in our students' future.

The QCHS Agronomy Team placed 23rd in the nation, earning the Agronomy Silver Team Award. As individuals, Jessica Cochran and Jared Wareham ranked Silver. Bryce Cluff and Noelle Rohovit ranked Bronze.

Former bulldog, Bryce Cluff, is currently serving as the 2015-2016 State Vice President. Throughout the year he spends his time traveling through the state visiting the man of the 77 FFA chapters in Arizona. As a state officer his duties are to teach students about premier leadership, personal grow and career success through agriculture education. As someone who wants to be an agriculture teacher himself, his time as a State Officer has helped him to gain the skills and experiences necessary to peruse his dream career. 
The Nursery/Landscape Team, members Paige Gangloff (senior), Cheyenne McQuade (junior), Aimee Bittinger (a 2015 QCHS graduate), and Nicole Van Eerd (a 2015 QCHS graduate).were tested on their knowledge of testing horticulture principals including plant anatomy, production, marketing, turf, landscaping design and maintenance. Each participant must also complete practicums involving a landscape estimating, plant propagation or potting, identification of plants, disorders and equipment. The QCHS Nursery/Landscape team placed 25th in the nation and was awarded the Nursery/Landscape Silver Award. Each individual of this team ranked as well. Paige Gangloff ranked Gold. Nicole Van Eerd ranked Silver. Aimee Bittinger and Cheyenne McQuade both ranked Bronze.

In addition to the two competition teams, two FFA members/officers joined the trip for the educational experience. Bailey Roden (sophomore), and Lexi Pettit (senior) attended workshops and Career Success Tours. These tours included Harvest Home Dairy, Blend Pak, Yew Dell Botanical Gardens, Muhammed Ali Center, Huber Farms, and Churchill Downs. "This was truly an amazing experience and proved what a great organization the FFA is. This experience has exposed me to so many career opportunities," said Bailey Roden.

The 88th National FFA convention was a success with a record breaking number of members and guests who attended this conference, over 65,000, who share the love for FFA. National FFA reported over 18,000 tweets from the conference. All of the students that attended this trip had a blast learning more about the great organization and were opened up to more opportunities in the agriculture industry. The Queen Creek FFA chapter looks forward to attending the 89th National FFA Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana in November 2016.




- AzMERIT Update
